### Methodology

This LO is divided into three units. Each unit contains different resources such as: videos, images, written texts, and audios clips for the students to use at any time. It is aimed to **B1 students** and the exercises are designed to explore the different skills of reading, listening, and writing.

The first part of each unit is the contextualization of the main topic and the second part is focused on practical exercises. Also, it is very important to look at the resources before you do the activities.

B1 is the English level where students are classified as independent users. A B1 student, can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure. etc.

B1 students can also deal with most situations likely to arise whilst traveling in an area where the language is spoken.

They have enough language to get by, with sufficient vocabulary to express him/herself with some hesitation and circumlocutions on topics such as family, hobbies and interests, work, travel, and current events.

#### B1 users are able to:

understand the main points of clear **standard speech** on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. I can understand the central ideas of many radio or TV programmes on current affairs or topics of personal or professional interest when the delivery is relatively slow and clear.

They can **understand texts** that consist mainly of high frequency every day or jobrelated language. The students can understand the description of events, feelings and wishes in personal letters.

**They can connect phrases in a simple way** in order to describe experiences and events, my dreams, hopes and ambitions. The students are also able to briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.

**They can write simple connected text** on topics which are familiar or of personal interest as well as write personal letters describing experiences and impressions.
